Dear Parents, Guardians and Caregivers,

Already into week three for students, I am pleased to advise our approximately 2,600 students have in general terms presented extremely well and ready for work. Despite the state-wide shortage of Teachers, here at P-12 we will continue to confidently strategize our way forward in this space.

The shift to an extended Homeroom of 30 mins on a Tuesday morning last year continues to pay dividends for both students and staff. This additional time is proving most successful with students having additional opportunities to receive ongoing and necessary counselling in a host of curriculum, teaching and learning, study skills, wellbeing, and pathway support. Assisting Homeroom Teachers on a daily and weekly basis are our Principal Class Officers (see below) and their respective teams of Heads of Year, their Coordinators, Wellbeing Practitioners, Learning Specialists, Student Voice, our IT Team, and the College's Engagement Team. Regular reflective meetings with these wonderful staff and indeed my twice termly catch up with our College Student Captains (*Captains Table*) will ensure the level of support is monitored and if required adapted and indeed tailored to meet the needs of our students over the year.

Please note these staff will continue to focus on the timely attendance of all students each morning and in particular the adherence to our College Uniform. This expectation has been clearly delivered in all of the Year Assemblies to this point (included in 2024 Student/Parent Handbooks) as has the need for individual student recognition and embracement of our PRIDE values both in classrooms and the yard. Lunchtime activities and clubs continue to feature in our daily delivery and are now in full swing. These eclectic offerings are once again being delivered and coordinated by a dedicated and passionate group of individuals committed to ensuring our very large student body receive a holistic educational experience whilst attending at P-12.
